Examined and approved Frank Rupnik for ordination as a Minister of the Word and Sacrament and called him as pastor of Bethel Murdoch Church.

Elected standard ordination examination readers: Janis Alling Adams (Mt. Auburn), Christena Alcorn (associate pastor, Knox), Tom Brackbill (pastor, Venice), and Nancy Schmidt (Pleasant Ridge).

Heard that the Committee on Preparation for Ministry has enrolled the following as Inquirers: Brenda Bene (Pleasant Ridge) and Tom Emery (Madeira-Silverwood).

Approved changes in the terms of call for ministers who serve in permanent pastoral relationships (i.e., pastor, co-pastor, associate pastor).

Shared joys and concerns.

Elected Paul Jordan (St. John's Westminster) to the Committee on Representation and Jack Plattner (Knox), Mary Ann Jacobs (St. John's Westminster), and Ethan Raath (minister member at-large) to the Ecclesiastical Affairs Committee.

Heard that the Nominating Committee plans to recommend that the
